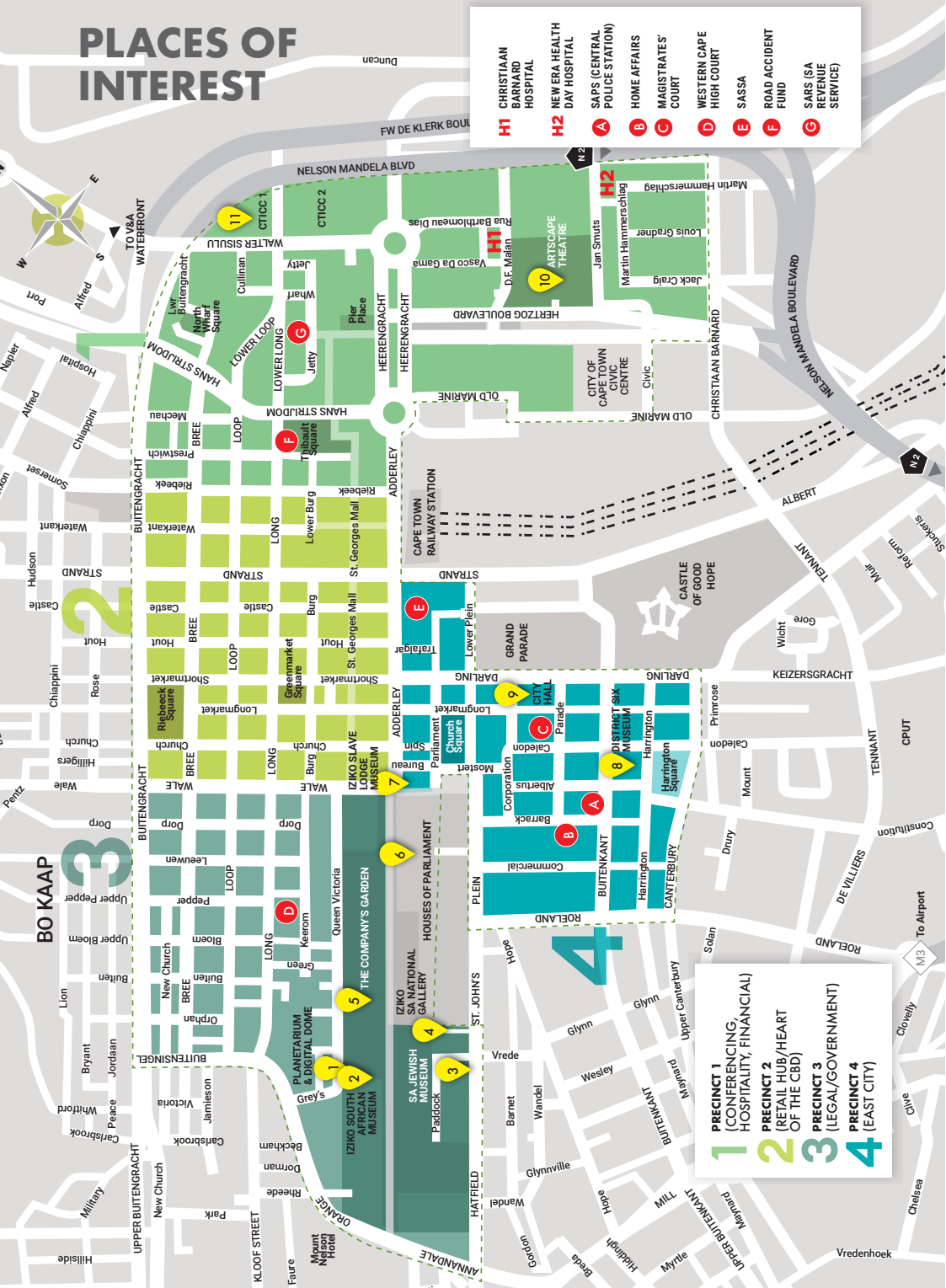

# STROLL SMART, STAY SHARP

Tips for a safe visit to the Cape Town CBD



## STASH BEFORE YOU DASH

- Don't leave valuables in your vehicle in full view of passers-by.
- If you need to leave your belongings in your vehicle, be vigilant when you stash them in the boot.
- Preferably, lock valuable items in the boot before you start your trip.



## LOCK & CHECK BEFORE YOU TREK

- Don't fall prey to remote jamming, a technique used to interfere with your vehicle's locking system.
- Always lock your vehicle's door and manually check them before you walk away.
- Stay vigilant when approaching and leaving your vehicle.



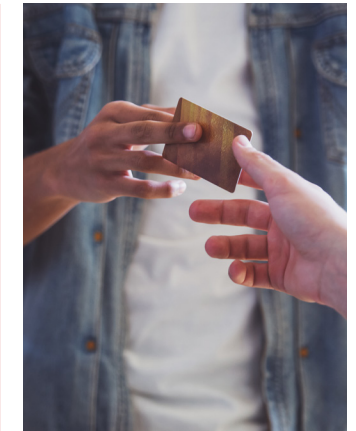
## HOLD TIGHT, OUT OF SIGHT

- Don't walk with your cell phone in your hand, keep it tucked away out of sight.
- If you need to use your phone, step into a nearby shop or building.
- Don't flash your jewellery, especially gold chains, to avoid chain-snatching.
- Hold tight onto your bag/s and ensure they are securely zipped or closed.
- Don't leave your wallet or cell phone unattended on a restaurant table.



## BE WISE, STAY SAFE

- You don't need a permit to walk anywhere in the Cape Town CBD. If you're asked to "buy" a permit, you're being scammed. Don't fall for it. Don't hand over your bank card or punch your PIN into any handheld or wall-mounted keypad. It's a scam.
- Don't let a stranger lead or accompany you to an ATM for any reason. If you need to draw money, ensure that no one can see you PIN.
- Don't allow anyone to distract you at an ATM.
