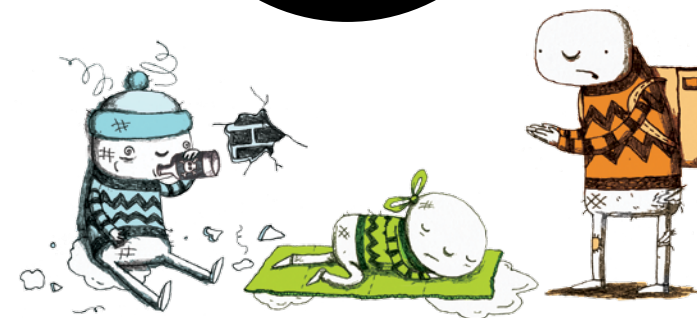


All monetary donations the CCID receives are split equally among six partner NGOs. The CCID takes no admin fee.
